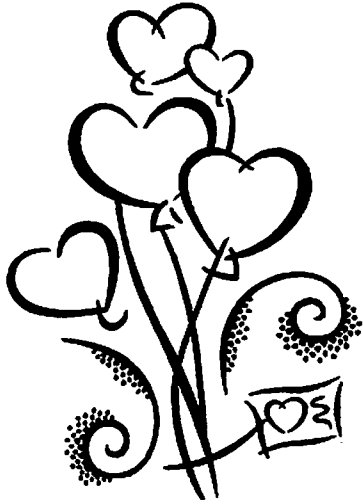

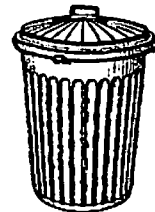
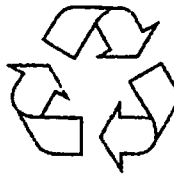


SICK CHESS

The Sugar Island Chess Klub (SICK) sent one representative to the 2011 Michigan Master/Expert/Class Championships in Lansing in January. Our player ended up in the middle of Class B with 2.5 out of 5 (2 wins, 2 losses, and a draw). The class championships tournament is one of the largest held annually in Michigan. It gives serious players a chance to compete against other players who have similar skill levels. Players are placed into a specific class under a "rating" system that keeps track of their performance in official tournaments throughout Michigan or even other states. The classes consist of novice (under 1000 or unrated), Class E (1000-1199), Class D (1200-11399), Class C (1400-1599), Class B (1600-1799), Class A (1800-1999), and an Expert (2000-2199) and Masters (2200+) class. Your rating improves when you do well against other players, with greater gains when you beat a better player. Here at SICK Chess, we have only one class of player--those who want to play for fun. We hope to see you for a fun game soon. (7:00 p.m. on Thursdays at the Hilltop).

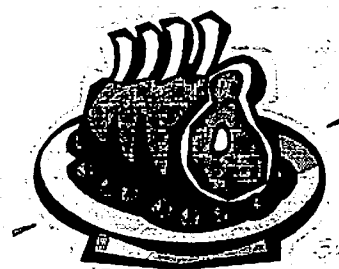

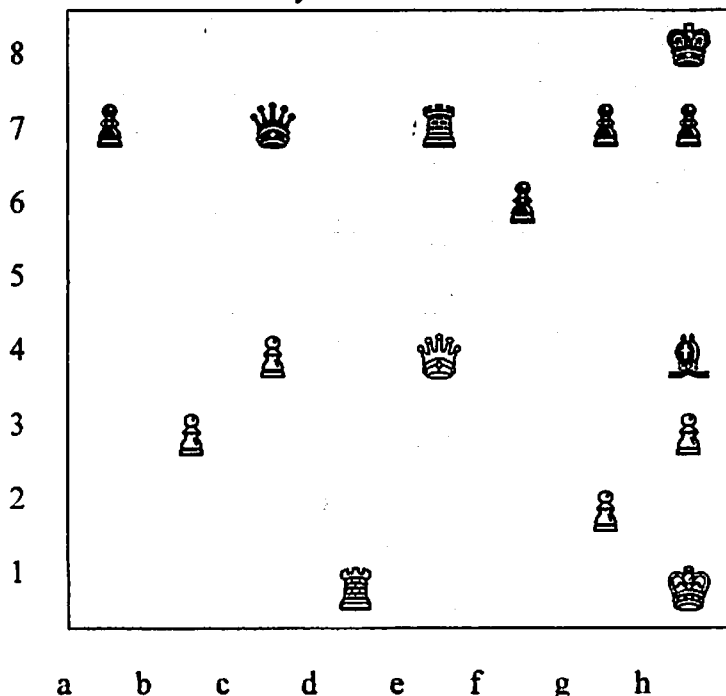

"SICK Chess for Sick Minds"

FIND THE MOVES—What is white's best move? (Theme: Mating Attack/Back Rank)

Difficulty Level: Moderate



- ♔/♚ KING (K)—moves one square in any direction
- ♕/♖ QUEEN (Q)—moves any number of squares in any direction (on rows, columns, or diagonals)
- ♖/♗ ROOK (R)—moves any number of squares sideways, forward, or backward (on rows and columns, not diagonals)
- ♘/♙ BISHOP (B)—moves any number of squares on diagonals
- ♞/♟ KNIGHT (N)—moves in an "L" shape (2 squares one way and 1 the other) to a square of the opposite color. Knights are the only pieces that can jump over others.
- ♟/♞ PAWN—moves straight forward (cannot back up) 1 or 2 squares on the first move and then only 1 at a time. A pawn can capture only on the diagonal squares immediately in front of it. Pawns can become queens when they reach the 8th row. Pieces CAPTURE ("X") by running into and displacing others. A king is in CHECK ("+") when it is attacked. CHECKMATE occurs when a player cannot save the king from capture.

ANSWER: White could gain back a piece by capturing the bishop, but white has a mating attack that will win the game. By moving the queen to the a8 square, white attacks black's king. Black must save the king and can only do so by blocking with the queen and/or rook, which white will then capture, attacking the king again and eventually leaving no escape. [1.Qa8 Qb8 (or c8 or d8) 2.QxQ Re8 3.QxRe8 mate]

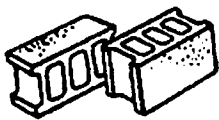

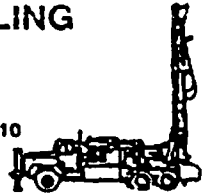
