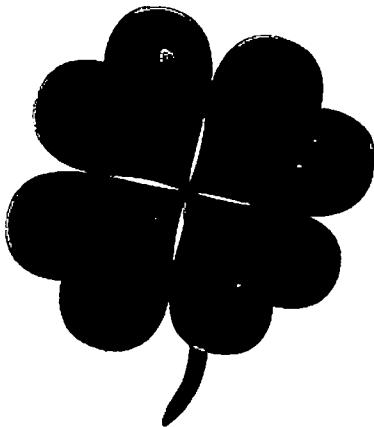

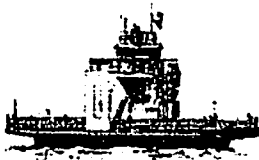

THE SUSPECT THEN FLED THE SCENE ON FOOT. A FEW WEEKS PRIOR TO THIS INCIDENT THE SAME UNIDENTIFIED MALE SUBJECT MADE TWO OTHER CONTACTS WITH THIS SAME VICTIM AND AUTHORITIES BELIEVE THESE CASES ARE RELATED. THE SUSPECT IS DESCRIBED AS A MALE OF ASIAN OR NATIVE DECENT LATE 20'S TO EARLY 30'S WITH DARK CURLY HAIR AND NO FACIAL HAIR AND A HEIGHT OF JUST OVER 5FT TALL. THE SUSPECT WAS LAST SEEN WEARING A BLACK COAT, BLACK SNOW PANTS AND BLACK BOOTS.
