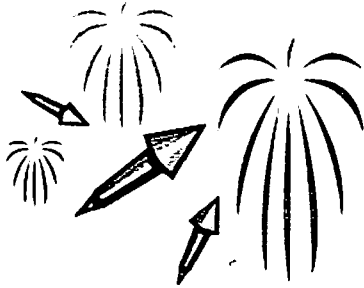

FIRE PLUGS

Have to start this article by wishing everyone a safe and Happy New Year from the Sugar Island Fire Department. We gathered earlier in December for our Christmas Party and we need to thank everyone for the large turnout. Since we normally only get together for *training* or at an emergency it is nice to be able to get together with our families and catch on old times. Or any time as far as Bruce is concerned (you had to be there to understand that point).

Our Fire Chief, Dave Pine, asked me to put in a reminder that people check their chimneys as the weather was warm and burning small slow fires can lead to creosote buildup. This led to two things happening. First it immediately turned cold, thanks Dave, and second two people contacted me about borrowing the chimney cleaning equipment the fire department has as their chimneys were plugged. So even though you gave your chimney its Fall cleaning it does not hurt to keep an eye on it during this time of year.

If you were on the Ferry on December 7th you may have wondered if there was an emergency as fire fighters were all over the boat. What was happening was the department was given a tour of the boat in case there was an incident. We will be putting together a pre-incident plan like we have for many of the public buildings on the Island that will be available to the fire department for planning, training and in the event of an emergency. Our thanks to the crew and EUPTA mechanics for the tour. One comment by the fire fighters was how clean the boat is kept and how organized everything is. Finally if you didn't change your smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries yet please do so as soon as possible. These can save your families life and only take a few minutes to install and service.

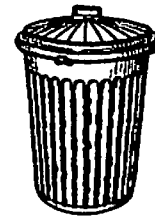
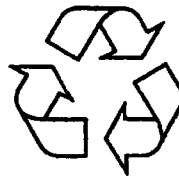
In Memoriam

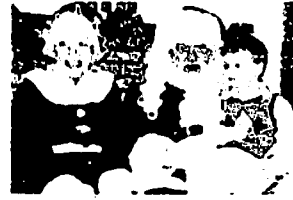

Sugar Island Chess Klub

"Not a Chess for Sick Minds"

FIND THE MOVES—What is **WHITE's** best move? (Themes: Piece Sacrifice/ Fork/ Material Gain)

Difficulty Level: High

♔/♚ KING (K)—moves one square in any direction
 ♕/♛ QUEEN (Q)—moves any number of squares in any direction (on rows, columns, or diagonals)
 ♖/♜ ROOK (R)—moves any number of squares sideways, forward, or backward (on rows and columns, not diagonals)
 ♗/♝ BISHOP (B)—moves any number of squares on diagonals
 ♘/♞ KNIGHT (N)—moves in an "L" shape (2 squares one way and 1 the other) to a square of the opposite color. Knights are the only pieces that can jump over others.
 ♙/♟ PAWN—moves straight forward (cannot back up) 1 or 2 squares on the first move and then only 1 at a time. A pawn can capture only on the diagonal squares immediately in front of it. Pawns can become queens when they reach the 8th row. Pieces CAPTURE ("X") by running into and displacing others. A king is in CHECK ("+") when it is attacked. CHECKMATE occurs when a player cannot save the king from capture.

ANSWER: White wants to force the black king to take the knight on f5 so that white can move the pawn on g2 to g4, "forking" or double attacking the black king and queen and gaining material. The solution is to move the white queen to e7, forcing the king to take the knight, and then move the pawn to g4. [1.Qe7+ Kxf5 2.g4+ and then capture queen next.] Note that 1.Re1+ Kxf5 2.g4+ Kxf4 3.gxh5 allows Rg8, regaining the queen (by pin).

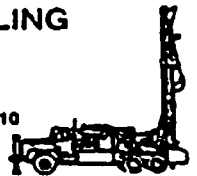

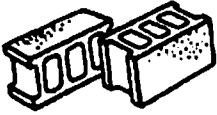
