

I suppose we could wait for the smoke and flames to show but we do like to get there quicker if possible.





## **Sugar Island Chess Klub**

"SICK Chess for Sick Minds"

FIND THE MOVES—What is BLACK's best move? (Theme: Back Rank)



- □/□ KING (K)--moves one square in any direction
- □/□ QUEEN (Q)--moves any number of squares in any direction (on rows/ranks, columns/files, or diagonals)
- □/□ ROOK (R)—moves any number of squares sideways, forward, or backward (on ranks and files, not diagonals)
- □/□ BISHOP (B)—moves any number of squares on diagonals
- □/□ KNIGHT (N)—moves in an "L" shape (2 squares one way and 1 the other) to a square of the opposite color. Knights are the only pieces that can jump over others.
- □/□ PAWN—moves straight forward (cannot back up) 1 or 2 squares on the first move and then only 1 at a time. A pawn can capture only on the diagonal squares immediately in front of it. Pawns reaching the 8<sup>th</sup> rank become a Q (or R, B or N).
- Pieces CAPTURE ("X") by running into and displacing others.
- A king is in CHECK ("+") when it is attacked.
- CHECKMATE occurs when a player cannot save the king from capture.

WHITE STARTED AT THE BOTTOM AND BLACK AT THE TOP

ANSWER: Nothing is gained by taking the white Q with the black R since the white knight then captures the R, forking K and Q and regaining the Q. Rather, black takes advantage of white's weak back rank by capturing the white knight on e4 with the Q. If white takes the Q with the pawn, then black mates by Rd1 (Qf1 and Rxf1 mate). If white instead takes the R, then Qe1 mates. [1...Qxe4 if 2.dxe4 Rd1 and mate next, if 2.Qxd6 Qe1 mate.]


